So Energy hands over oxygen, cylinders to TGH

OIL marketing company, So Energy Ghana, has presented 20 units of oxygen-filled cylinders to the Tema General Hospital as its contribution towards the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic in the Tema

metropolis, ought to be supported in order to effectively manage the threat of COVID-19 cases.

"We took into consideration the critical and sensitive role that the hospital was playing as a frontline health institution in the Tema metropolis in the fight to manage and control the pandemic," Mrs Selormey said.

The company will also refill the cylinders at no cost to the hospital for the next three months to ensure sustained supply of oxygen over the period.

Making the presentation, the Managing Director of So Energy and Downstream Ghana, Mrs Yvette Selormey, said the gesture was based on the Tema metropolis's classification as a hotspot for COVID-19 infections within the Greater Accra Region.

She said the hospital, which is a major referral facility for patients in and around Tema and also serves as a treatment centre for the COVID-19

hospital, Rev. Francis Ackah, commended the company for the gesture, saying it would go a long way to support the hospital's efforts to effectively treat COVID-19 patients, in particular, and, more generally, all other conditions which might require some form of liquid oxygen therapy.

The Metropolitan Chief Executive (MCE) for Tema, Mr Felix Nii Anang-La, said of the 13 COVID-19 cases recorded in the Tema metropolis, eight of them were as a result of community infections, while five were imported cases.

So far, 874 contacts of the 13 infected persons, he said, had been traced and tested, while community sensitisation programmes were also underway to reduce the spread.

The assembly, he said, was stretched financially since the recent implementation of the partial lockdown had affected the assembly's revenue mobilisation effort.

"For now, we are looking at other sources in order to mobilise revenue to fund the activities of the assembly and also effectively deal with COVID-19 and other health related issues in the metropolis," Mr Anang-La said.
